2019 Year in Review

Our most significant accomplishment of 2019 was the completion of two new trails in Adams Camp: Cheddar Shredder and Haulapalooza. The addition of these trails has created over three new miles of singletrack that complete a cohesive loop within the Adams Camp network. These trails are a critical step in reaching our long-term goal of total connectivity within our Stowe trail network.
